Last season in review

An enjoyable and quite successful season for our club — and we once again fielded no less than ten teams. The 1s, 5s and 8s all finished in the top three of their respective divisions and the 4s stole the show by winning their division. A creditable performance all round especially since we were a little short of players towards the lower end of the club on some Saturdays.
